Priming Fidelity Checklist

Rationale: An evidence based antecedent intervention used to preview activities before upcoming transitions or new situations. This short and concise strategy familiarizes the student with the actual materials or activity before he/she actually uses the materials or participates in the activity. Priming may remind the student how/when to use a taught skill.
